International Camps

This past summer CISV Jacksonville sent more than 30 representatives to 10 locations around the world, including:

- · Villages in New York and Italy
- Portugal for Interchange (and hosted Portuguese children for two weeks)
- · Costa Rica for Youth Meeting
- Step-Up Camps in Washington, DC and Tennessee
- Junior Counselors to Philadelphia and Norway
- International Junior Branch Conference and IPP in Salvador, Brazil
- Seminar Camps to El Salvador and Brazil

Hosted Camps

In Summer 2013, Jacksonville hosted two camps: FACES (which brought together more than 30 11-year-olds delegates from different cultural groups in our area) and an international Step-Up camp (14–15 year-olds from Brazil, Colombia, Italy, Canada, Denmark, Sweden, Indonesia, France and the US).

FACES, Jacksonville's own twoweek village camp celebrated its 10th anniversary. This makes FACES the longestrunning residential village in the nation. FACES was founded by former City Council President Lad Daniels on the CISV principal of global friendship while developing future community leaders at home.

More than 30 volunteers transformed Fletcher Middle School into a campsite, with more than 20 rooms prepared for all the fun and necessary activities.

Special thanks to our CISV volunteers, including host families who make hosted camps such a great success.
